RESOLVED by the Senate and House of Representatives, concurring that the following Articles be proposed to the Legislatures of the several States, as amendments to the said Constitution, to be valid to all intents and purposes, as part of the said Constitution; viz^{to}

ARTICLES in addition to, and Amendment of the Constitution of the several States, pursuant to the fifth Article of the original Constitution.

the first..... After the first enumeration required by the first Article of the Constitution, there shall be one Representative for every thirty thousand Persons, until the number of Representatives shall amount to two hundred, after which the proportion shall be so regulated by Congress, that there shall be not less than one Representative for every thirty thousand Persons, nor more than one Representative for every fifty thousand persons.

the second.... No law, varying the compensation for the services of the Senators and Representatives, shall take effect, until an increase of compensation has taken effect.

the third..... Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances.

the fourth.... A well regulated Militia, being necessary to the security of free States, the Congress shall provide for organizing, arming, and disciplining the same; and to govern the Militia when called into actual service, in such manner as they shall judge best, subject to the discipline and regulation of the States, when not actually in service.


